EXPLANATION OF SERVICE AREA ORDERS AND DECREES

- Service Area Orders state that the Watermaster has the responsibility to supervise the distribution of water to the land areas defined in the Orders. The Orders assigned a tract number to each land area (or place of use) defined in Decree paragraphs, these numbers have been modified over time as tracts were added, excluded, split, combined, or otherwise modified.
- Decrees define the point of diversion, order of priority, rate of diversion and volume of water to be applied to the place of use.
- Orders to revise Service Areas should be approved by Superior Court whenever there is a change to the place of use.
- Supplemental Decrees should be completed whenever there is a change to the point of diversion, purpose of use or place of
 use. Changes to Decreed rights do not necessarily require approval by the State Water Resources Control Board, although
 certain licenses, permits and funders require landowners obtain approval through the 1707 process implemented by the
 Division of Water Rights.
- Page 245 of the Shasta River Decree defines the responsibility of the Watermaster and is the first page to an Appendix of Decree Tables that have been updated over the years and are now called Field Schedules.
- Both the Decree and Service Area Orders are necessary for determining the Watermaster's scope and area of responsibility.

The relative rights, based upon prior appropriation, of the various claimants to the waters of Shasta River and its tributaries, in Siskiyou County, California, having been established by decree entered by the Superior Court of the State of California, in and for the County of Siskiyou on the 30th day of December 1932, in The Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights, Based Upon Prior Appropriation, of the Various Claimants to the Waters

APPENDICES.

Explanatory.

For the purpose of showing the relationships of the several rights by appropriation to the use of the water of Shasta River and its tributeries established by the foregoing decree, chronoligically arranged summaries of the various rights, during the irrigation season and also during the nonirrigation season, are herewith submitted as Appewrices I and II, respectively.

Appendix I consists of Table 1 to 11, inclusive, showing the relationships of the several rights during the irrigation season in each of eleven units into which the stream system has been divided.

Inch of these units can be administered more or less independently of the others during the low flow or critical period of each season, therefore the rights in each unit have been grouped together as shown in said tables. In the first column of the respective tables the relative positions of the various rights in each unit are designated by numerals. The second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth columns are self-explanatory. In the last column of each table the numbers of the sub-paragraphs of paragraph III of the decree in which the respective rights are defined are given.

Appendix II shows the relationships of the several rights during the nonirrigation season over the stream system as a whole. The arrangement of the summary is similar to that of the tables in Appendix I, except that an additional column has been included under "Amount", in which column the amounts of the storage rights are expressed in acrefeet per season.

OUR DILEMMA... THE WATERMASTER'S RESPONSIBILITY IS CHALLENGED WHEN...

- Transactions to change the point of diversion, purpose of use or place of use are proposed without an assessment by the Deputy Watermaster or when not completing the necessary Orders or Supplemental Decree.
 - Refer to District policies regarding exception for temporary transactions exercised under W.C. Section 1011.
- Diversions of water that are outside the Watermaster's scope and area of responsibility are being exercised during low flow conditions or at critical periods of time.

RECOMMENDED SOLUTIONS...

- Create local management opportunities to improve confidence that flows required to meet downstream needs, including fish survival, can be accomplished.
- Complete Orders Revising the Shasta River Watermaster Service Area to finalize transactions implemented by the Department of Water Resources and add volunteer riparian water right users.
- Seek Safe Harbor and Incidental Take Protection for the District, its staff and participating customers.
